Summary:

Under the supervision of the Executive Director, this position collaborates with the Vice Principal and Administrative Team to build a school-wide culture of belonging. Under supervision of the Executive Director, the School Counselor leads the Behavioral Team in development of the school's PBIS and SEL programming; is active in the RTI / EBIS process; manages 504s and student behavioral plans; provides direct behavioral support; facilitates suicide, bullying, and abuse investigations and reporting; manages the Backpack Buddies program, and serves as liaison to the PSO to provide supports for students and families.

Responsibilities (include, but are not limited to the following duties):

- Community Liaison:
 - o Serve as a liaison between student, home, school and community services
 - o Conduct outreach to parents to encourage their participation in school activities: PSO, volunteer, Parent/Teacher conferences, school events
 - o Conduct home visits as needed, facilitate and support teacher home visits
 - o Create and update list of family support resources posted on school website
 - Plan and execute community events and workshops/trainings based on family/community needs
 - o Conduct community outreach to create more awareness of MITCH as an educational opportunity

Data Collection:

- o Review attendance data, conduct multi-level data collection via surveys, classroom observations and empathy interviews
- o Manages 504s for qualifying students. Attends all 504 parent and/or team meetings; maintains accurate and timely records.
- o Develops & implements student support plans and monitors / reports student progress on a regular basis.
- o Work closely with the Reading Interventions Specialist, Literacy Specialist

Programming:

 Plan interventions and collaborate with staff to support students who are exhibiting lack of engagement of chronic absenteeism; build attendance incentives

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- o Plan SEL interventions and collaborate with staff to support students one-on-one or in small groups
- o Collaborate with staff to create whole class SEL lessons and culturally responsive teaching practices specific to the needs of the children
- o In conjunction with Admin, facilitate 504 meetings and collaborate with teachers to ensure student modifications are implemented
- Assist in managing the RTI / EBIS processes to identify students in need of further assessment and/or enrichment or intervention including Section 504 evaluations.
- o Attend all EBIS meetings
- Additional work
 - o Carlines help if needed
 - o Recess help if needed

Knowledge:

- A bachelor's degree from an accredited University (required);
- A current (or currently pursuing) master's degree in school counseling or social work (preferred). Could be an opportunity for currently enrolled master's students.
